Placing Holds from Home

Did you know you can now place holds from home. In order to place a hold, you must first login with your library card and PIN#. When you search our catalogue, click on "Details" and if the book is out, you will see "place hold" in the middle of the screen, or if the title is available you can click on "Place Hold" on the left hand side of the screen under the "Keep" button. If the title is currently out, you will be placed in the queue. You can keep track of your position from your account. If the title is on the shelf, we will pull it for you and have it waiting on the main floor on the holds shelf within three hours, or the next day when we open. You will not be phoned for on-shelf hold requests and we will hold the book for five days. Please ask us if you have any more questions regarding this.
